Mini-recycling centre opens

Downton now has its own mini-recycling centre. It is situated around the back of the Baptist Church and available for all to use. The aim is to collect specific items that can be recycled, but are not collected at the kerb-side by the council, or elsewhere in the village. It has been organised by Downton



Green Group, with the support of the Baptist Church, who have kindly provided the premises – and the shed!

There is an additional collection point at St Laurence Church, and arrangements are in hand to transport things from there down to the centre on a regular basis. Many of the items collected will be used to raise cash for charity. Volunteers regularly check the collection baskets and move things on as needed. The work is all done by volunteers. Anyone dropping off recycling, can really help by making sure that only those items specified are left and that the shed is left tidy. Any food wrappers should be free of food residue, and everything should be clean and dry.

So far, a large load of plastic milk bottle tops has gone to support Wilton Riding for the Disabled, water filter cartridges have been taken to Tesco's, and a consignment of flower pots has been recycled via Stewart's Garden Centres. Making use of the centre helps to ensure that less of Downton's rubbish ends up in landfill.



FENCING ERECTED IN THE MOOT

The trustees of Downton Moot have been considering plans to improve the accessibility and safety for the visitors, which includes looking at ways to reduce the risk of falling from the bridge in the Moot. Meanwhile, temporary fencing has been erected on the bridge to reduce the risk to visitors.

There have been several negative comments made in response on one of the village FaceBook groups about putting up any fencing as well as the impact of the temporary fence.

Some Moot Trustees have responded by pointing out that they have a 'duty of care' to the visitors and therefore need to consider advice relating to health and safety matters.

A final decision on what measures will be put in place will not be made until a sympathetic



approach has been agreed with Heritage authorities. The plans are part of ongoing work to improve the paths around the gardens over the past 12 months.








CLIMATE ACTION EVENT: SATURDAY 21 SEPTEMBER




BOWLS CLUB NEWS

RIVER FOOTBRIDGE PROPOSAL

A Parish Council working group has been progressing plans for a new footbridge over the river. Earlier this year, engineering company CTS Bridges was commissioned to produce a Feasibility & Design Study. The proposed route, which emerged from market research, would cross the river from the end of path running down from Moot Lane opposite Twynhams Close. The Study was financed by a grant given to the Millennium Green by developers to improve access to the Green.

CTS do consider it possible to build the bridge from the eastern bank of the river where access is easier. Two options for the bridge were offered with the favoured one, also the cheapest, being a 'triangulated truss with a hung deck and a cable supported structure'. The likely total cost for this option, which includes design, access clearance, bridge manufacture & delivery, construction and hire of equipment, was considered potentially achievable. A smaller amount will be required to prepare the path from the western bank to South Lane.

The Parish Council will apply for planning permission so that the project becomes 'Shovel Ready' meaning that, once finance is obtained, construction can be started straight away. The big challenge will be finding the necessary money. This is not expected to be achieved by increasing the Parish Council precept (the parish element of Council Tax) but from grants and crowd funding. The Working Group will be investigating all available avenues and any ideas of where to source some money would be welcome. Contact Jane Brentor, Amenities Committee Chairman, janebren555@gmail.com.




SIX CLASSES TO ENTER IN MOOT FUN DOG SHOW



LOCAL INITIATIVES FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

The local cabinet of Wiltshire Council – the Southern Wiltshire Area Board – has awarded over £40k in grants to local projects and initiatives this year, as well as running a series of themed public events and meetings. Downton has benefited from grants that have gone towards: a new speed indicator device; a new gardening club for elderly residents of the local sheltered housing scheme; the 'Go wild at the Moot' event which took place in May; new floodlights and netting at the football club.

A new collaborative initiative is the Silver Salisbury programme of activities for older people, which will run from 20 September to 13 October. The idea is to support and encourage members of the older community to venture out and take part in a wide range of (mainly) free
